"He is Risen: Alleluia!"

At dawn on Easter morning, some women went to the tomb of Jesus to finish preparing His body for burial, but were astounded to find the body missing. Mary Magdalene reported the empty tomb to the Apostles, and Peter and John returned to the grave with her. They walked inside the tomb and saw the burial cloths still lying there, which convinced John that Jesus had risen. After they left, Mary Magdalene saw a man standing nearby and, when Jesus spoke her name, Magdalene realized that her Master was alive. While the Apostles that night were discussing the reports about Jesus from Mary Magdalene and the two disciples who met Him on the road to Emmaus, suddenly the Lord came through the locked door and said, "Peace be with you." Some of them thought that Jesus was a ghost, but after He had something to eat, they began to believe that He had come back to life.

During that appearance on the first Easter, Jesus gave us the Sacrament of Penance when He told the Apostles, His first priests, "Whose sins you forgive are forgiven them, and whose sins you retain are retained."

Over the next 40 days, more than 500 people saw Jesus and, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles on Pentecost, they went out and convinced 3,000 people to become followers of Christ. We all have the same responsibility to lead people to the risen Lord.
